Some may remember a machine set up in arcades and carnivals where couples could pay a quarter each to test their love for one another. In 1969, up and coming Nintendo created its own Love Tester. For a moment, let me share with you the story behind these love testing machines.



In her article, "Inside a Decades-Long Quest to Measure Love," April White writes that in the fall of 1937, Ed Keefer was a senior in the school of engineering at the University of Toledo in Ohio. Tall, slender, and bespectacled, Keefer was the president of the calculus club, the vice-president of the engineering club, and a member of the school's exclusive all-male honor society. He also invented the Cupidoscope.

The electrical device could not have been more perfectly designed to bring campus-wide fame to its creators, Keefer and his less sociable classmate John Hawley. It promised to reveal, with scientific precision, if a couple was truly in love. As the inventors explained to a United Press reporter as news of their innovation spread, the Cupidoscope delivered on its promise "in terms called 'amorcycles,' the affection that the college girl has for her boyfriend."

Built in the school's physics laboratory, the Cupidoscope was fashioned from an old radio cabinet, a motor spark coil, and an electrical resistor. To test their bond, a man and a woman would grip electrodes on either side of the Cupidoscope and move them toward one another until the woman felt a spark—not of attraction, but of electricity. The higher her tolerance for this mild current, the more of a love signal the meter registered. A needle decorated with hearts purported to show her devotion on a scale that ranged from "Blah/ No hope" to "Uncontrolable/ See preacher!"

It all sounds like a slightly painful party game—but the Cupidoscope was one experiment in a serious, decades-long quest to quantify love. This undertaking garnered the attention of leading scientists across the United States and in Europe in the early years of the 20th century, and it is memorialized most prominently in the penny arcade mainstay known as the Love Tester.

True love, however, is not measured by how long you can hold a handle on a arcade game, or purchasing the most expense Valentines card you can find. True love is shown when our love for one another is giving and unconditional. It is a love that is defined in John 3:16,

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." And I John 3: 16, which says, "1 John 3:16 "By this we know what love is: Jesus laid down His life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers. This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters." This love is amplified by Paul when he writes in Ephesians 3:17-19, ""Then you, being rooted and grounded in love, will have power, together with all the saints, to comprehend the length and width and height and depth of the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge" As believers, we can truly learn to love others because we know how much God loves us.

Josh and Nakienya invites everyone to their wedding shower after worship in the fellowship hall on **February 16**. They are registered at Amazon and Walmart.




Brooklyn Bivens to be Baptized

On February 23 during worship, we will join Will and Kelli Bivens in the celebration of God's gift of love, Brooklyn Bivens, in her baptism.




Bridal Shower


Men's Bible Study on Revelations Saturday's at 9am


Wednesday Night Bible Study @ 6pm
